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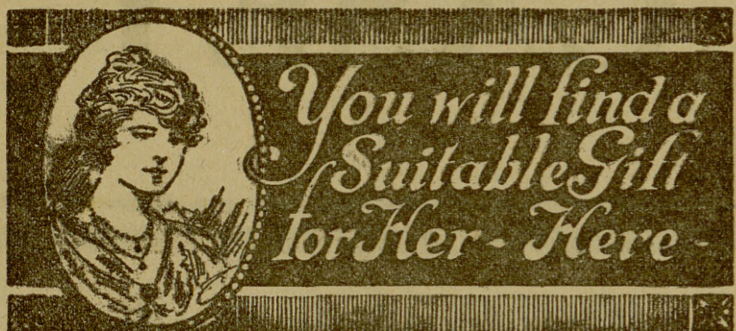

Nov. 13, 1920.

The A. and M. Yell Leader,
Dear Sir:

I am writing you in reference to the Thanksgiving game here in Austin on November 25, 1920. If it is at all possible I would like to see you before that time and talk over some very important matters with you. Please let me know if you will be in Austin anytime before Thanksgiving. If you will not be up here before that time let me know when you will come up so that we can get together for a while.

Perhaps you have heard it reported that we are planning something also that would bring on a fight. There is quite a bit of strong feeling up here over this game and anyone of these things is sure to bring on a fight.

I know that Texas does not want our athletic relations broken, and I feel pretty sure that A. and M. feels the same way.
