A Longhorn will be given to the student who sends in the best selection of kodak pictures. Think of it! Absolutely free! And we don't have a thing to do with your trust fund either.

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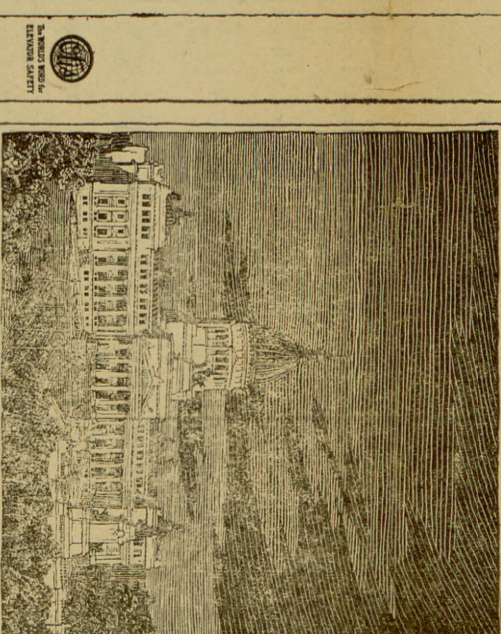
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Ancient History.
