ceived Big Treat.

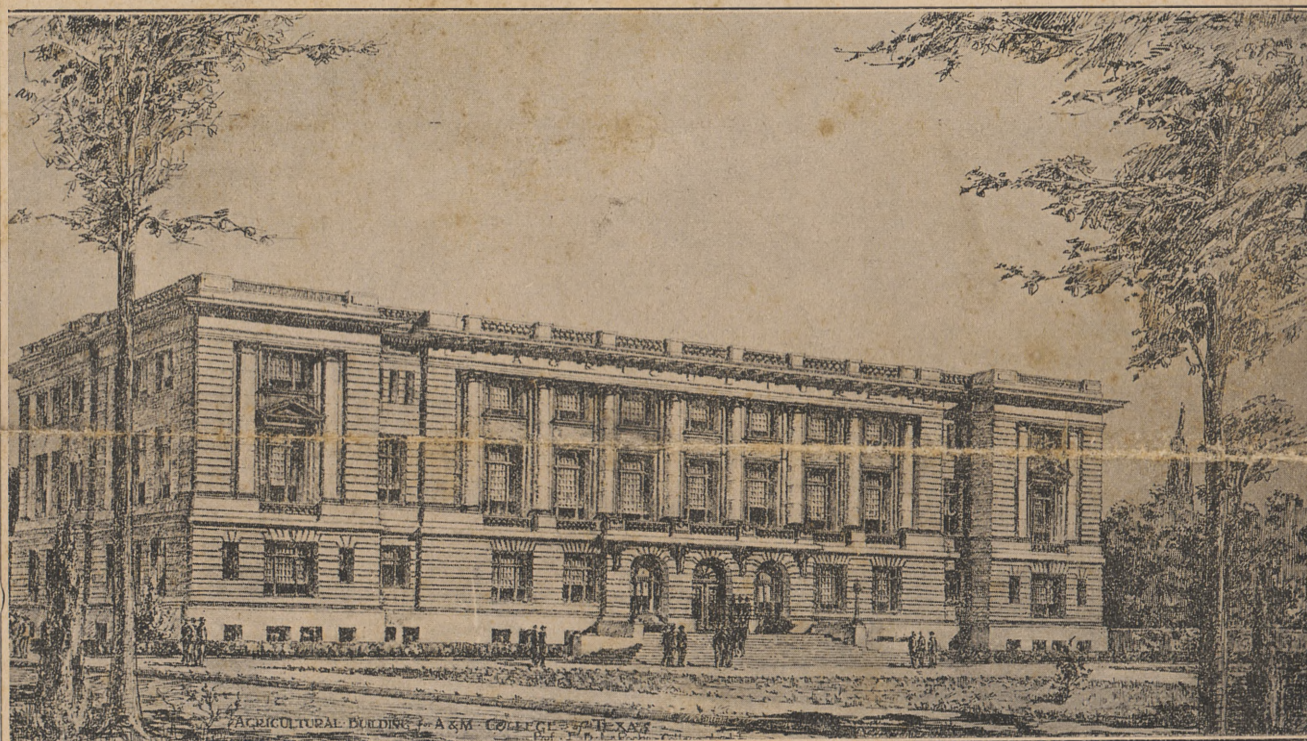
Mrs. Allie Chalmers Pierce re-
