

Farmers Overwhelm Russellville Aggies, 40-0

Fay Wilson and Mitt Dansby Star For A. and M.

Pounding the line consistently and sliding off tackles and ends, the Aggies augmented their collection of points for the season by a score of 40 to 0 over the Arkansas Aggies of Russellville, Arkansas. The victory was an easy one and Coach Bible played every man against the opponents during the course of the game which in reality was only a stiff scrimmage.

Dansby and Fay Wilson battered through the Arkansas line time and again for gains, most of the time plowing directly through center or the guards. The Arkansas team fought cleanly and consistently but were plainly outclassed by the Maroon and White. It may be said of them that they were as true sportsmen on the field as have ever played a game on Kyle Field.

Tucker, playing quarterback for the visitors, was their most consistent ground gainer. He handled their punting and managed to get every punt off well. Moore who was substituted for Powers at right half early in the game, and Averby, a substitute for Arlington at full threatened to carry the ball to within scoring distance during the final quarter when on two occasions they advanced the ball about thirty yards in a driving passing attack.

In the early part of the first quarter after an exchange of punts by which the Aggies gained approximately 25 yards, Berry started the initial drive on the Arkansas 45-yard line and marched down the field steadily, making four first downs one of which was obtained by a pass from Dansby to Red Wilson for a gain of twenty yards. With the ball on the one-yard line, Mule stepped through center for the first touchdown of the game.

After another swapping of kicks the ball was on the visitor's 20-yard line. Fleming of the Arkansas aggregation fumbled the ball and Red Wilson covered it. Berry, Dansby and Fay Wil-

son carried the ball to the one-yard line once more and Fay bucked it over for the second touchdown. The quarter ended soon after with the ball in possession of the Aggies on Arkansas' forty-yard line.

In the second quarter, after another exchange of punts, the ball was under Berry's control again and beginning on the opponent's thirty-two yard line he had the oval carried to the one-yard line where Dansby carried it over. Here it was that on a bad pass from Brazleton, Little Jimmie Forgason snatched up the ball and tried to drop kick the ball for that other point. The attempt was blocked, however.

With the exception of Clem Pinson, who had gone in earlier as a substitute for Kishi, a new team was injected into the game. Bill Pinson was the director of the new outfit and before the quarter was over he carried the ball over for another touchdown and booted the goal. The half ended with the score 27 to 0.

At the start of the second half, the first team was in again and by passes and kicks scored another marker, Little Jimmie again putting it through the goal posts.

In about the same length of time Dansby plunged over for another six points but this time Forgason failed to kick goal.

The third quarter ended with the ball in Arkansas' possession on A. and M.'s forty-two yard line. After two plays in the fourth quarter there was a complete substitution of the Aggie team. The ball was again in the hands of the Arkansas team and here they staged a twenty-five yard drive but fumbled the ball and Meitzen recovered. Pinson punted after a couple of bucks and the visitors again drove for about twenty-five yards. The Aggie line stiffened and the ball went over but Bill Pison soon gave it back to them and the quarter ended on a run by Overby for ten yards.

The Arkansasites had two mighty good men in their line, G. Hamm at right tackle and Stokes at left end.
