Music lovers of Bryan and College will have an opportunity to hear some native talent in a programme at the Palace Theatre in Bryan on the evening of January 26. Mr. Samuel Frances Johnson, brother to the famous Aggie athlete, Bull Johnson, will be the leading artist on the programme. Mr. Johnson, better known in professional circles as Samuel Frances, is just back from a tour of the United States as assistant artist to Mortimer Kaphan, the greatest portrayer of Dickens' characters in the United States. After having toured his native state, he will return to New York where he will continue studies in art. Close followers of the 'radio world' will no doubt recognize some familiarity in the programme, for Mr. Johnson has been prominent in radio concerts as well as on the stage.
