



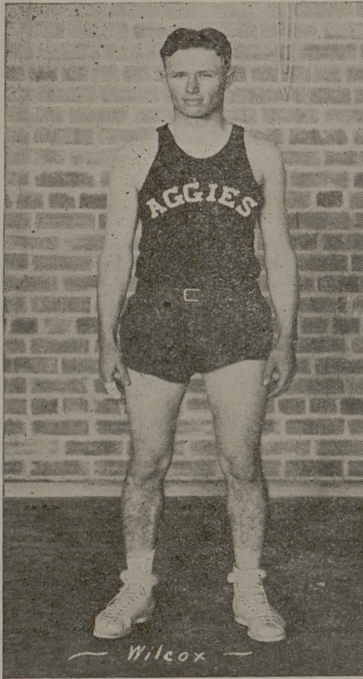

Captain-Elect 1926 Basketball Team.

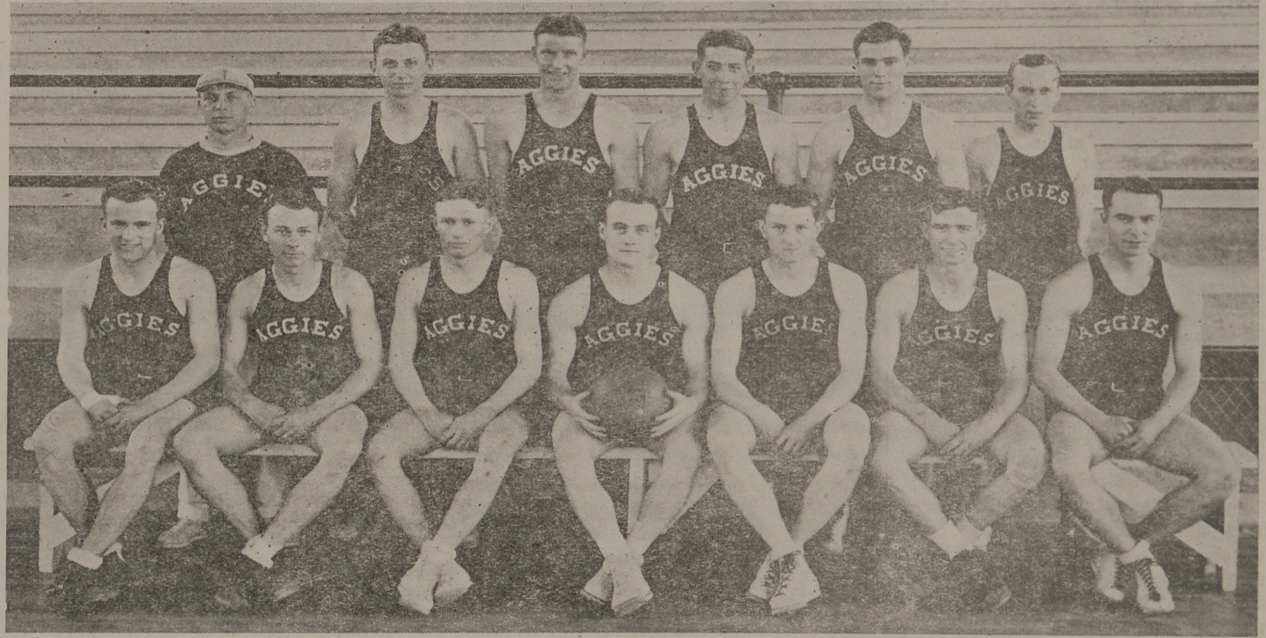
