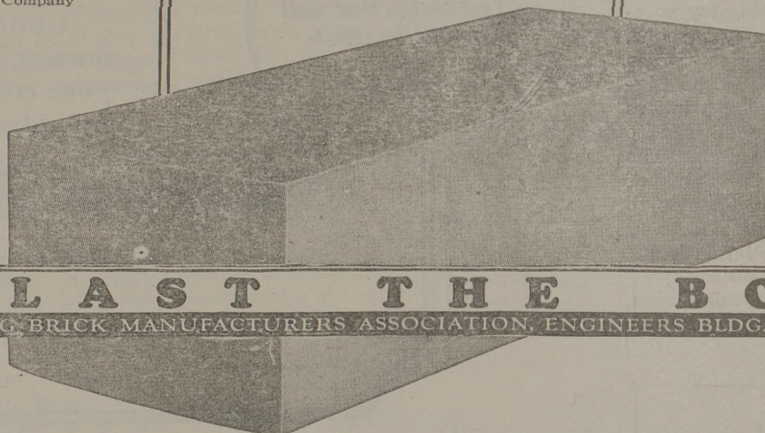
Where do you go from here?
