COMMISSIONS ARE GIVEN AT TARLETON

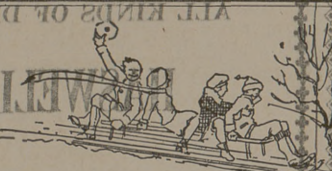
