After his death, among his papers was found an autobiography which is said to be one of the most human and interesting documents ever.

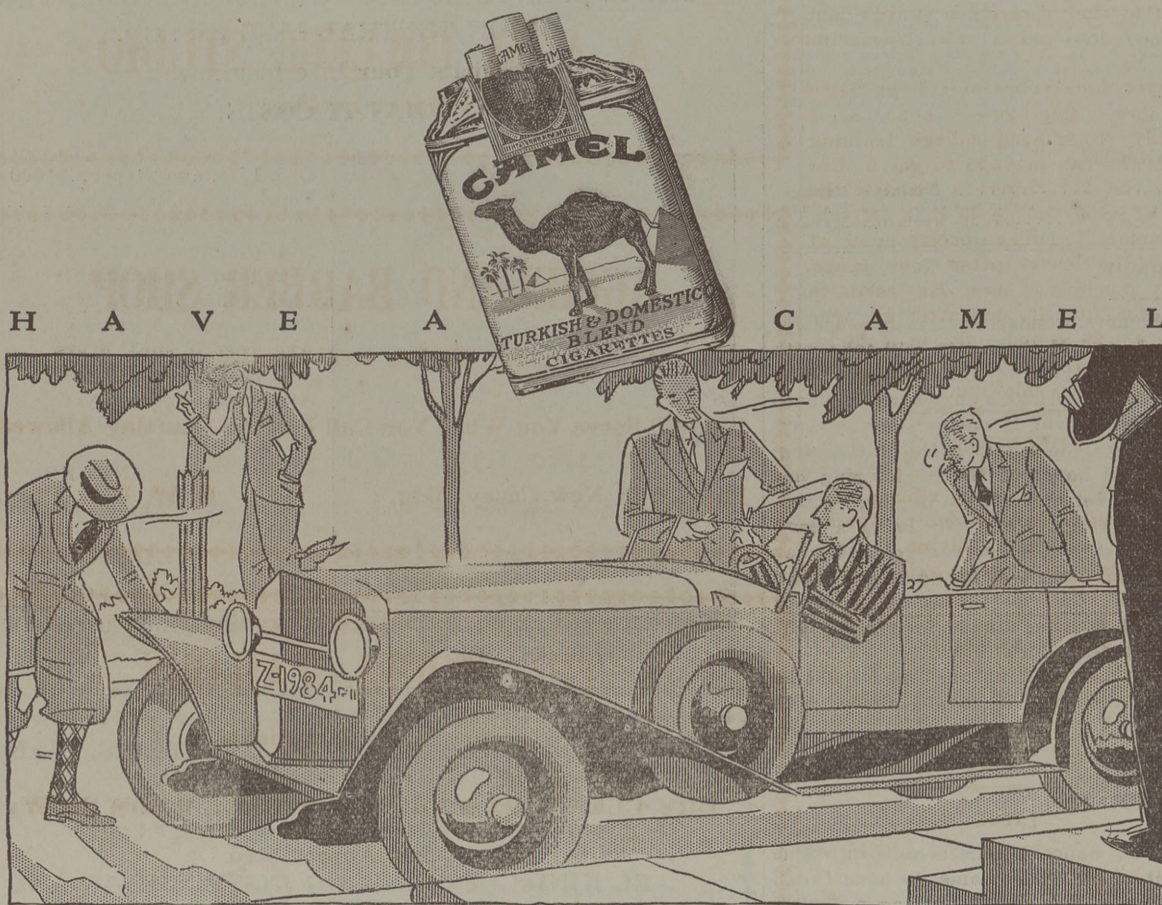
The book is in the shelves of the E. E. Library and the picture may be seen in the office of Dean Bolton.
