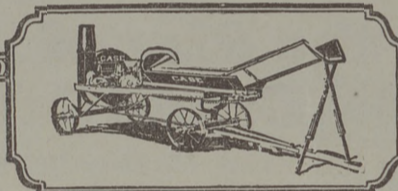
would soon be a race across the
