to be a marked characteristic of A. and M. freshman cadets enrolled this year in the infantry freshman rifle course known as Course D. Results of the marksmanship trials, just announced by Captain L. R. Besse, U. S. A. (DOL) instructor in the course, show that a total of 275, or 83 1-3 per cent, out of 330 registered for the course, qualified.

Eighteen of the freshmen qualified as experts, 60 as sharp shooters, and 197 as marksmen. Only fifty-five failed to qualify.

Several experts on cotton marketing from the United States Department of Agriculture and a number of outstanding cotton men of the State will be at College Station for the summer school of cotton to be held at A. and M. from June 6 to July 16, J. B. Bagley, professor of textile engineering and in charge of the summer session, has announced.

A cotton burr extracting machine, which it is said may revolutionize cotton picking, especially in West Texas where the sledging method has come into wide use, has been invented by R. B. Cozart, '10, of Lufkin, after three years of experimenting. Announcement of the new device was made by Attorney John M. Spellman of Dallas, who aided in developing the machine and handled the patents.
