## WORLD'S BIGGEST MACHINE

With the labor and skill of more than a thousand men, the actual work of constructing the world's most powerful machine has begun at the plant of the Brown Boveri Electric Corporation at Camden, N. J. Their labors will be converted into energy equivalent to the man power of 6 million men working eight hours a day.

The machine is a 60-cycle turbo-generator ordered by the United Electric Light and Power Company for installation in Hell Gate station of the New York Edison Company, New York City. In all phases of construction, cost, weight of castings, degree of efficiency and capacity, this machine represents an enterprise more than twice as great as any similar enterprise ever attempted.

A volume of water greater than the 5,000-gallon-an-hour low-water flow of the Delaware River at Port Jervis will flow through the generator system and forty carloads of coal per day will feed the boilers supplying steam for the turbine. The generator, in turn, will develop power sufficient to illuminate all the streets and three quarters of the homes of New York City. The generator will have rated continuous lead capacity of 215,000 horsepower. —Exchange.

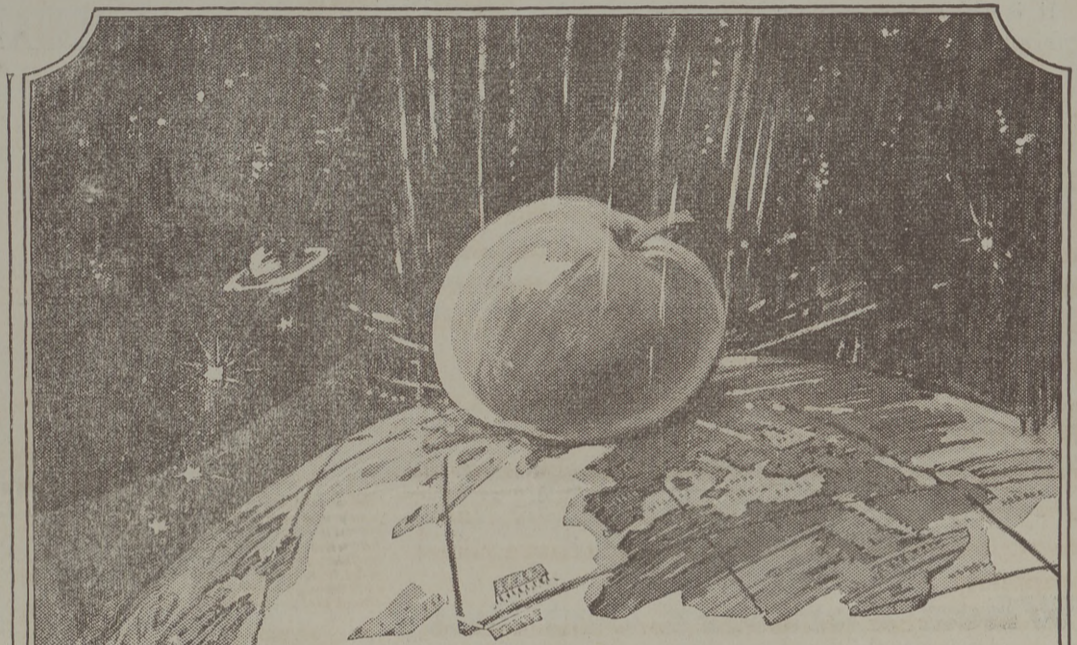
