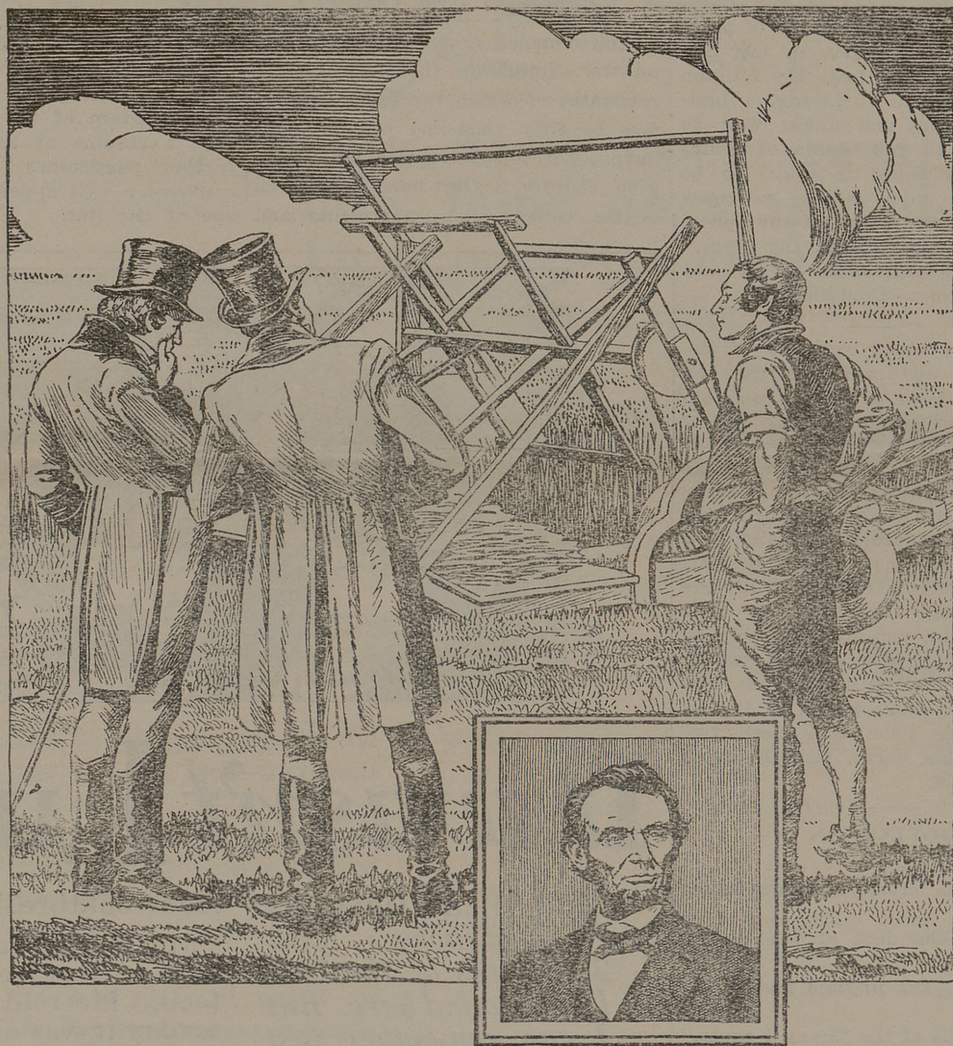
take it as a game or as a means of hoarding millions of dollars of dangerous wealth.
