Professor Dan Russeil, head of the Sociology department at A. & M., addressed the conference on "The Rural Press and its Relation to Agricultural Journalism." The present status of the rural press and the importance of journalism in this kind of school were both discussed and emphasized. The gist of the talk was that students at Agricultural Colleges must be trained to direct the rural press if it is to function to its greatest capacity to the farmers. Professor Russell also emphasized the importance of training journalism specialists in the indus-

trial fields as there is a growing need for technically trained writers to direct industrial publications.

Once I thought I saw the Colorado mountains beckoning to me, but the blue sky was too much for me; I got so homesick for Indi-

ana's slush and the fried chicken out to old Aunt Mary's that I beat it back at the earliest opportunity. And here I remain in spite of jobs tendered me in Boston and New York and two chances to put myself on Uncle Sam's payroll as a diplomat.
