The track was very fast, and good time was made in all the events. The high hurdle race was a weird affair, Slocomb of the Aggies and Baldwin

of the Steers both falling down, but Baldwin managed to get up and finish third. Dick Winders won the two mile race, but old "Warhoss" Shoemaker ran a good race, and gained the respect of Levi, who tried to pass him on the last turn. Micheal showed plenty of fight in both his races, and he is expected to place well in the conference meet. For the second time this season, both Hodges and Tracy beat the mighty Daniels in the Quarter-mile. In the field, Floyd won the Javelin with ease; Farmer won the broad jump with a leap of 22 ft., 9 1/2 inches; "Red" Ashley showed indications of reaching his old form in the pole vault, while Stiteler continues to hit around 12 feet all the time. Aided by a nice breeze and a good start, Wilkey of Texas tied the conference record in the 220, even though he pulled a muscle in doing it. Dan O'Neil was ten yards behind at the hundred yard mark, but closed the gap to mere inches by the time they reached the finish.

With their well-rounded team, the Aggies are slight favorites to win the championship, but it is anybody's race until all returns are in.
