NEW UNIFORM REFUND PLAN ADOPTED

According to a change made in regulations for the ensuing year merchandise in uniform equipment purchased from any reputable dealer will be accredited to students' accounts and the government refund allowed on it. Heretofore the equipment had to be bought from the Exchange Store. In the future the plan to be adopted will be different.

In harmony with this plan each dealer should provide himself with a sufficient supply of the slips containing the city or town, date, name of purchaser and address, name of dealer and address, and a space for purchased merchandise to be enumerated by article. Students should

ask for these slips to be filled out when buying equipment. They should then be turned in to the fiscal department of the college before June 1st. And the individual account containing the entire student's purchases will be maintained in the department. At that time, if his purchases entitle him to a refund, then he shall be remunerated.

(Editor's note): It seems that in this, something has been accomplished which we have been in need of for quite a while. Not only was it a cause of much comment and criticism on the part of the student body, but also, from our standpoint, quite unfair. The fact that the Exchange Store in the past has been the only dealer authorized to handle this situation has met with wide disapproval, and has failed completely to

take care of the condition for the simple reason that many students, especially upperclassmen, do not care to make their entire purchases from the Exchange Store. In the future we believe the plan will be much more satisfactory.
