November 20 is celebrated by Berlin, Germany, as a day of Repentance. The custom was established in 1892 by the Prussian General Synod under the protection of the state. This year no newspapers were published, dancing, theatres, moving pictures, music in cafes and concerts except of a serious and sacred nature were interdicted. The streets were almost deserted.
