Several representatives of the Amtorg Trading Corporation, Russia5s largest purchasing agents, were on the campus this week studying production of cotton, according to R. H. Lander at the Aggieland Inn.

At present there are more than 7,500,000 acres of cotton planted in Russia, an increase of 2,500,000 acres over last year, and since their land and climate is more similar to that of Texas than to that of any other state, they decided to make a study of the conditions in this locality.

"Russia is fast discarding their age-old methods of agriculture, and copying from the United States", said H. S. Mansoff, president of the Amtorg corporation, "Some of our farms include 500,000 acres or more, and all are worked on a cooperative basis", he further revealed.

Other members of the party included S. M. Saenke, government agronomist, and Nicholas W. Wassilieff, agricultural engineer. After inspecting the experiment farms, the party departed enroute to California.
