Mr. Sullivan advises that all students obtain their ticket on that date if possible as all unsold tickets will be returned to Austin early in the week.

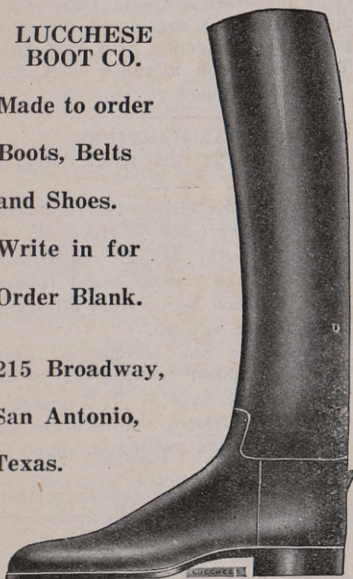
Definite round trip rates to Austin have not been announced yet, but it is probable that the rate will be \$2.30.

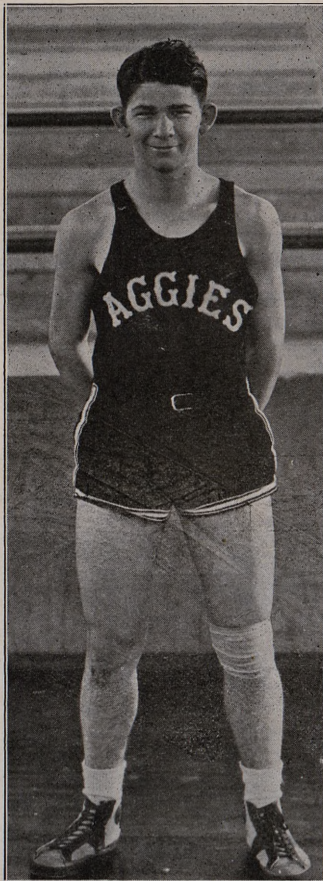
