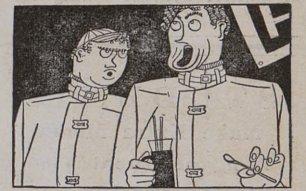
was placed on the 5 yard line, Mason plunged through tackle for the touchdown.
