EASTER CHAPEL SPEAKER

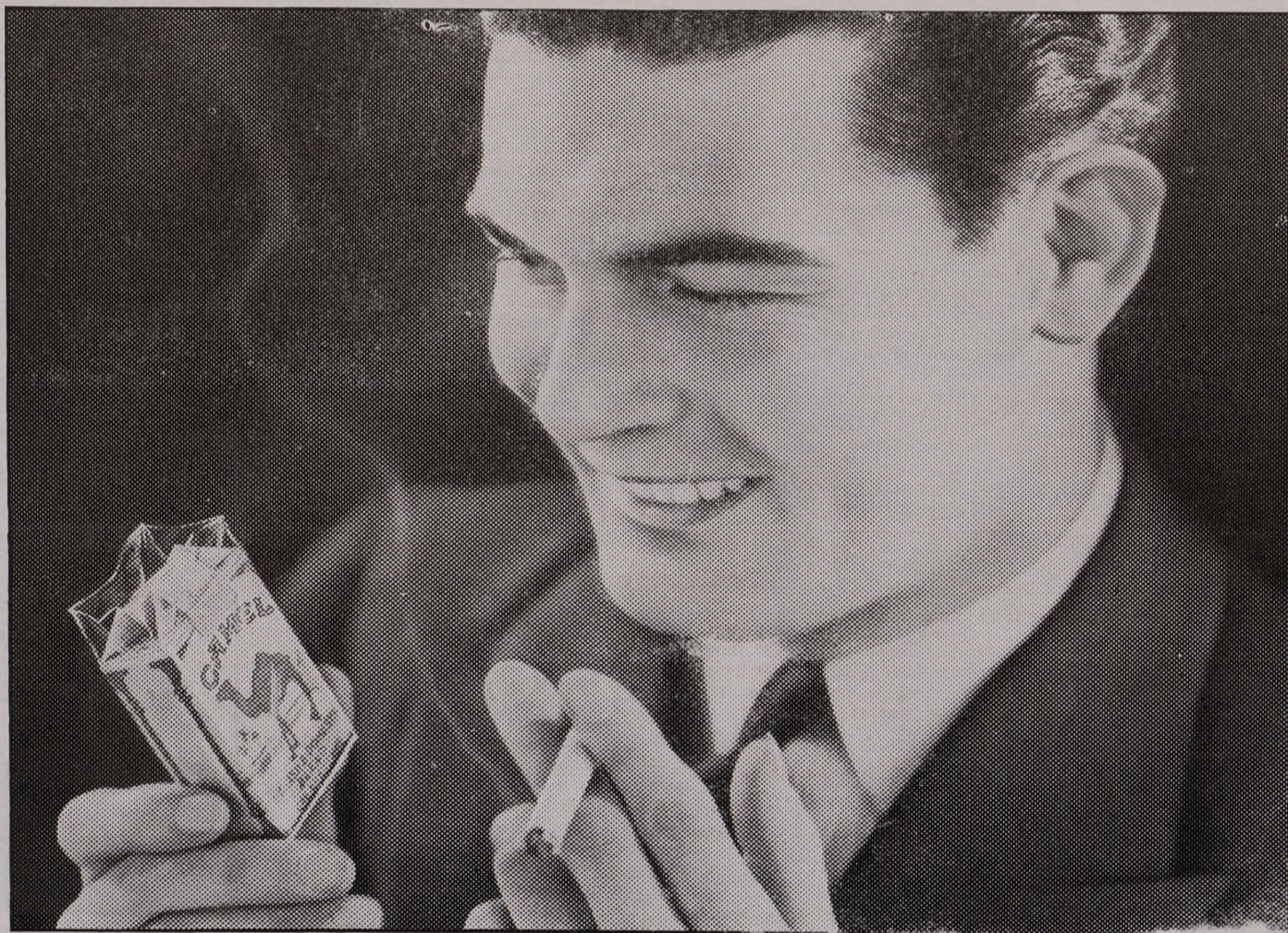
