Cafeteria Plans For Mess Hall Are Denied By Friley

Rumors to the effect that the mess hall next year will be operated on a cafeteria system were denied by Dean Charles E. Friley, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences this morning. There will not be any material change in the system used at present, it was announced.

"Considerable discussion has been had from time to time, in regard to changing the mess hall system of operations, but there have been no changes along these lines for the next year. Reductions have been made in the maintenance fee, which includes meals and dormitory fees; and next year may be paid in four payments per term, should the student so desire," Dean Friley said.

"The cafeteria style may be later put in the mess hall, but there are several difficulties which at present have not been overcome that will prevent the change at the present."
