Home Eco Training Prevents Divorces

LINCOLN, Neb.—Miss Margaret Fedde, chairman of the Home Economics Department at the University of Nebraska, has reason to believe that her courses tend to make business slow for the divorce courts. Only two divorces have been recorded among the 380 marriages among graduates of the department.

"We don't mention divorce in our classes," she said. "I'm not set against divorce, and at times I believe it is the only solution to some domestic problems. But we emphasize home-making and think about it definitely as a career."

Ideas among coeds as to matrimony and home-making are changing, she said. Ten years ago few girls in college went about the business systematically of preparing for marriage. Now many of them are taking courses and training with the definite idea of marriage in mind, even though the future husband may not yet be in sight, she said.

Livestock Is Being Groomed For Annual State Stock Shows

Grooming has begun on fine cattle and swine, bred and reared by the animal husbandry department of the Texas A and M College, for entry in the two state livestock shows, the Houston Fat Stock Show at Houston and the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show at Fort Worth.

Entries for the Houston Fat Stock Show will include a carload of Hereford, Shorthorn and Aberdeen Angus beef cattle, and a carload of Hampshire, Duroc Jersey, Berkshire and Poland China hogs. An entirely different group of livestock will be shown at the Fort Worth show than will be exhibited at Houston, according to D. W. Williams, head of the college animal husbandry department, but the number and breeds of the cattle and hogs will be approximately the same. In addition, about eight Percheron and five saddle horses will be shown at Fort Worth.

A meeting of committee chairmen for the ball and pageant was held Monday for the discussion of various details. Considerable progress in plans for the event is reported.



Sex Education Not Solution for Major Marriage Problems

CHICAGO, Ill.—Failure of sex education to solve major problems of marriage and the relationship of men and women was charged this week by Dr. Elizabeth Whitney, consultant in mental hygiene at Stanford University, who came to Chicago to attend a meeting of the American Student Health Association.

"There is more unhappiness in marriage and more confusion in the relationships of men and women than ever before," she contended, declaring that the movement for general sex education has "loosed a flood of talk until sexuality has become an obsession."

She maintained that the college girl of today should realize that her feminine and emotional qualities must not be stifled in her struggle to equal the other sex mentally. As it is, she said, woman's struggle for education equal to that of man's is bringing destruction to her finer senses and ruining her moral character in many instances.
