

### "B" ENGINEERS WIN ANN'L INTRAMURAL TRACK MEET SUND'Y

Helbing of San Angelo High Point Man With Three First Places in Meet.

By the narrow margin of 2 1/2 points, Company B Engineers nosed out Company A Engineers Sunday afternoon in the annual intramural track meet held on Kyle Field. The final score, which was determined in favor of the Engineers after the last event of the close meet, was 23 1/2 to 21.

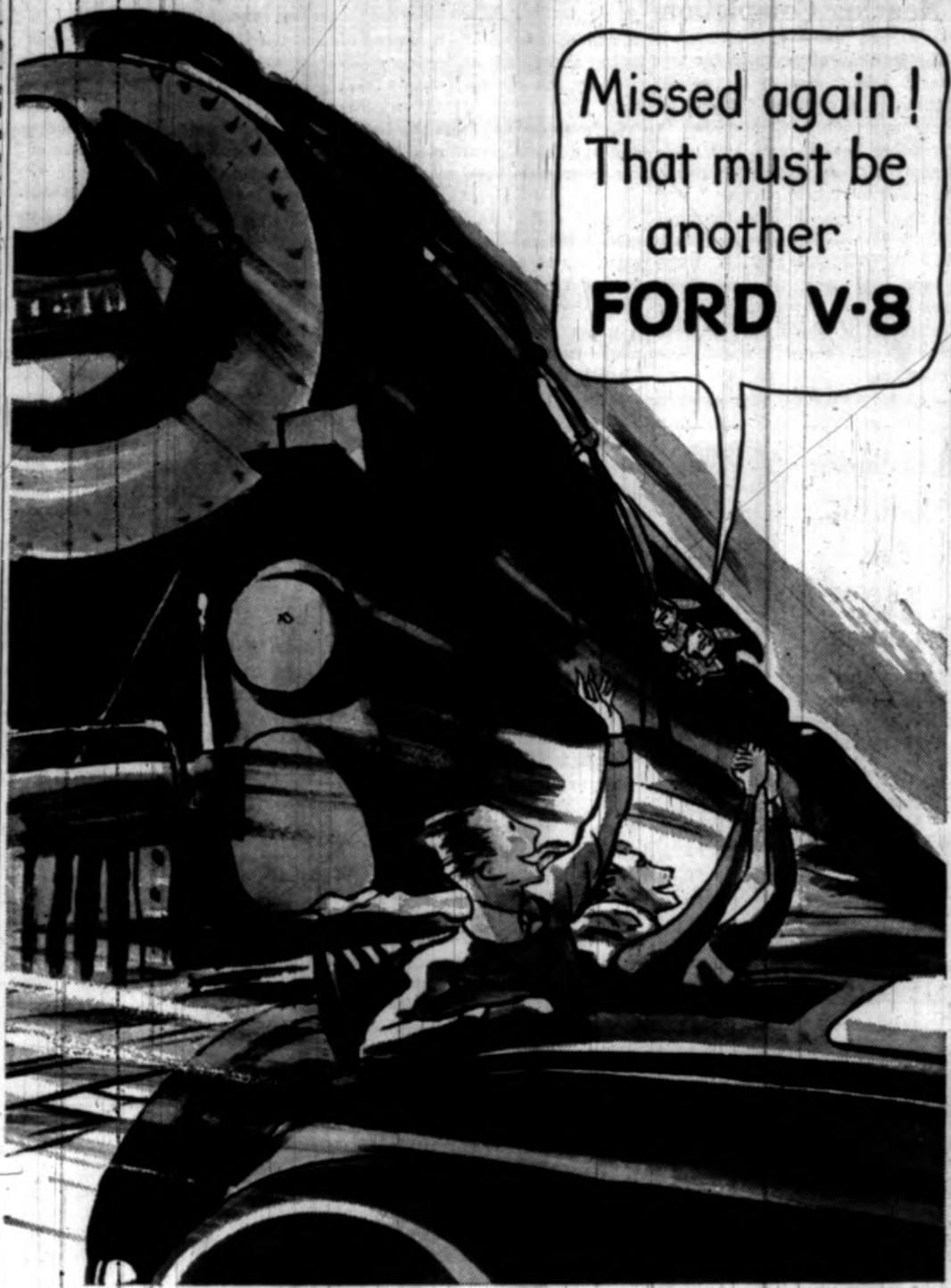

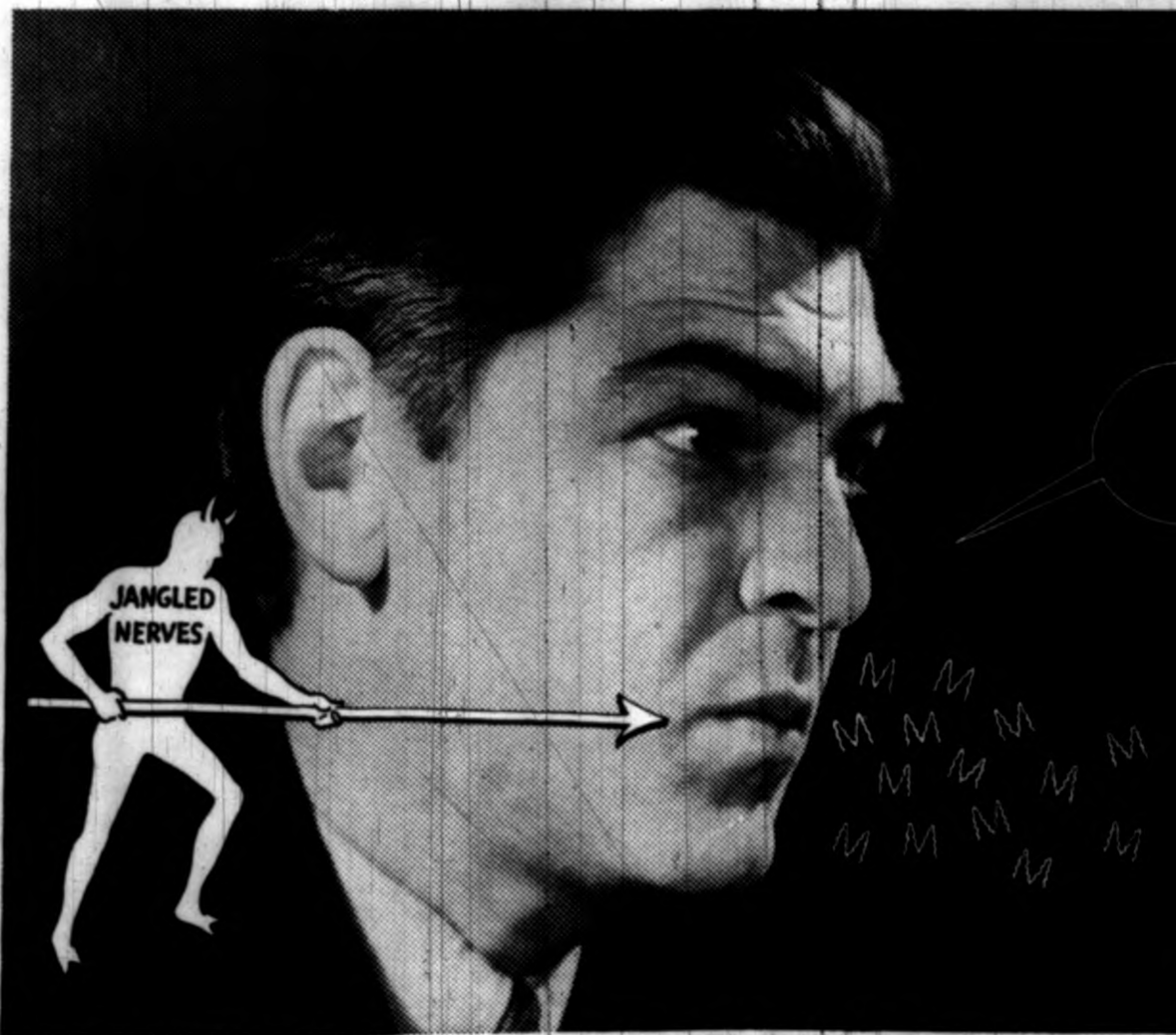
