connections with these organizations should be continued. This work together with my regular College duties, which have been considerably increased with the heavy enrollment of students and the now pressing and vital problems confronting Agriculture, is going to require constant and thorough study on my part. I believe, therefore, that it is best for me to be relieved of my athletic duties and responsibilities. I feel that this action can well be taken now since we have assembled here one of the most efficient and best coaching staffs ever brought together in the Southwest and there probably has never been a time when our student body and former students were as enthusiastic and as hopeful of the future as now.

I believe it will be proper for me to record here that the Council has taken the following recent actions:

- (1) Restored Golf and Tennis as minor sports.
- (2) Added swimming as a minor sport and employed our first swimming instructor and coach.
- (3) Made plans for greatly enlarging Kyle Field by including all of the College land lying south of the present athletic grounds.
- (4) Arranged three interstate games for this year.
- (5) Begun negotiations for a game with the University of Mexico to be played in Mexico City during the Christmas Holidays of 1935.
- (6) Begun negotiations for a game to be played with West Point.
- (7) Assembled probably the best balanced coaching staff ever to represent any institution in the South.

I believe that I should also record here that during my tenure as chairman, there has not been a particle of dissension among the members of the Council and I believe every single vote on every important issue has been unanimous.

I am sure you will understand that due to my past association with the athletics of this institution, I am taking this action with a heavy heart. My interest in athletics shall continue just as much as ever.

I am resigning with the satisfaction of having the belief that the way has been cleared for the most successful period in the history of athletics in the A. & M.

**SOUTHERN SCHOOLS  
FACE SCHEDULE OF  
HARD GAMES SAT.**

Every school in the Southwest Conference has a hard game before them this week as A and M, Rice and Texas invade the East, Baylor goes over to Lubbock to play the Texas Tech Matadors and Arkansas and T C U clash in Fort Worth in the first Southwest Conference football game of the year.

The Aggies have the toughest game of the group when they encounter Pop Warner's Red Devils in Philadelphia Friday night. The Aggies have only two practice sessions before they take the field with the Temple team.

Rice will go to Lafayette Indians for a game with Noble Kiser's Purdue Boiler-makers. The Purdue eleven boasts two of the outstanding backs in the country. Rice will not be handicapped with the training problem that confronts the Norton coached team.

Jack Chevigny takes his University of Texas Longhorns to Notre Dame to combat against his old alma mater in an attempt to try the Rockne system of football against the team that originated the system. The highly touted Hilliard is in shape and will get a deal trial as the Steers battle the strong team. The Notre Dame team is a good club yet, but they have not been as successful in recent years as they were in the reign of Rockne.

Morley Jennings' Baylor Bears have about the lightest game of the week with the Texas Tech Matadors, although this team is no set up for any team. In fact the Bears took the team too lightly last year and the Matadors trampled them under their feet 13 to 0. The Baylor mentor is expecting the offense to give him some trouble and has spent a week in hard blocking sessions. The blocking of the Baylor team last week was not so hot.

S M U go to Baton Rouge Saturday to battle with the L S U Tigers in what should be a game

battle. The Tigers fought a 9 to 9 tie with the Rice Owls in Houston last week. S M U should show more defense than the Rice Owls as they invade the Louisiana soil. The S M U line is doped to be the best in the conference. Only a trial with another Southwest Conference contender will settle that.

T C U and Arkansas open the Southwest Conference football race with the two teams meeting in Fort Worth. Coach Bear Wolfe has been working his contenders hard during the week. He held a long and hard scrimmage with the frosh Monday afternoon. The Frogs have a powerful passing team. The Razorbacks are spending most of their time on a passing defense.
