

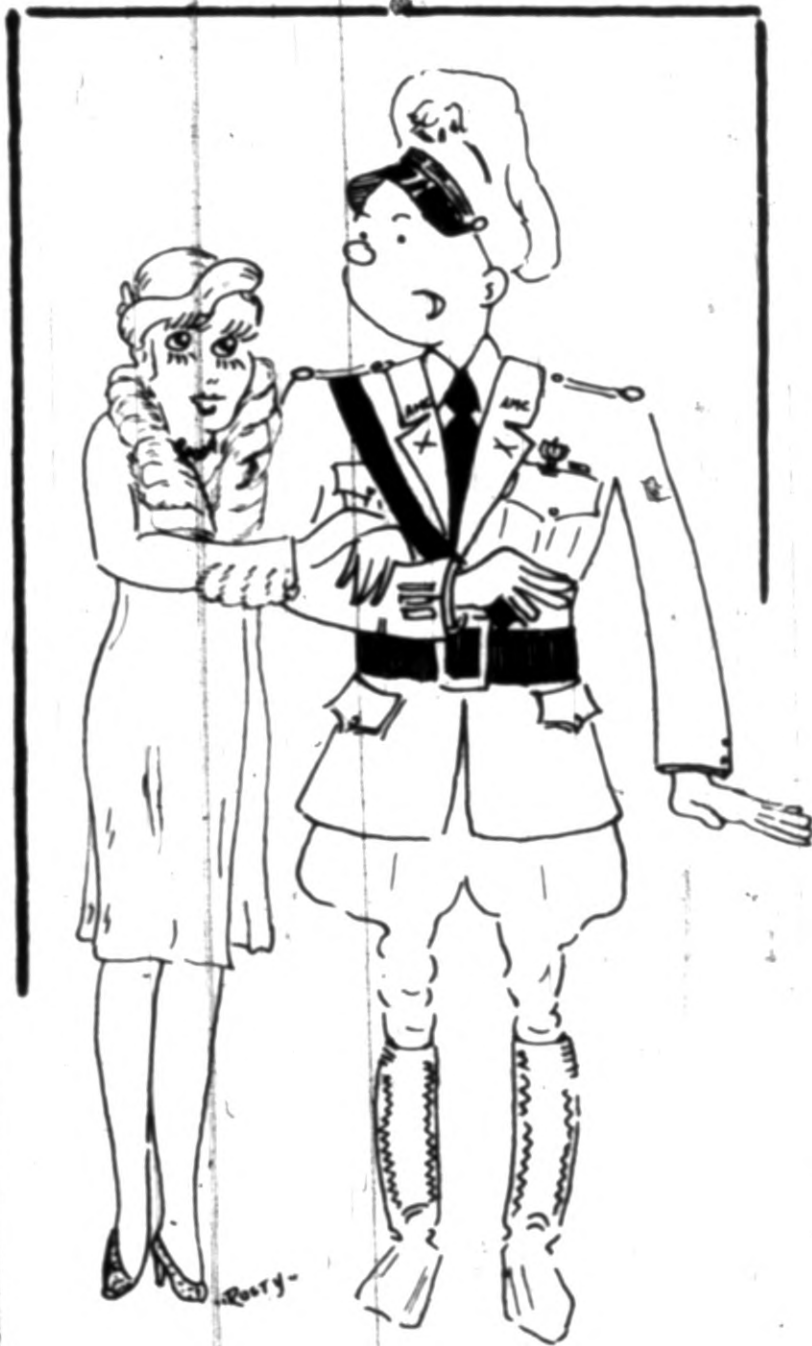
VIVA SLIDE RULE—
