Campus and general country wear: a three-button notched lapel Shetland jacket of brown hound's tooth check pattern, cut on easy fitting lines, and made with patch pockets; natural shoulders and center vent, grey flannel slacks, blue Oxford shirt with round collar attached, striped rep tie, white cashmere sleeveless pullover, one-piece top cap of black and white Shepherd check.
