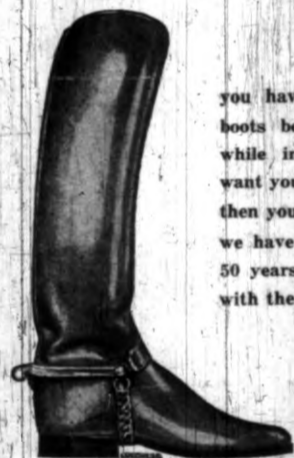

SPORTS PARADE

Uncle Billy Disch even forgave him for hitting that home run and wianing the flag for the Aggies over his steers last year.

Harry Cohn held the opposition to a batting average of .187 to lead the league in that department.

Alsbrook tied with Westerman of Texas for scoring the most runs

with 19. Williams led in two baggers with eight. Stone led in stolen bases with 12 thefts.

Nolen and Bell tied with Jackson of S. M. U. for gaining the most walks with 12.

The Aggies were second in batting with a .287 mark. Texas was first with a .291 average.

A and M and Texas should fight it out for first place again next year. The Aggies promise to be much stronger and the Steers will be about like this year. All of the teams in the league should be stronger, even Rice who had a veteran team this year, but could manage to win only one game. At least they can be any worse.

The Aggies will lose only Woody Bell from the team.

All sports are over at Aggield for the year, with the exception of a few exams and they are not exactly sporting things, and the next thing to look forward to is football season next fall. The Aggies promise to be just as strong and maybe stronger next fall than the past one. A few stars were lost last year, but the team as a whole should be a better working machine. One or two spots in the line will have to be better fortified than they were in spring training, but the backfield with "Slick" Rogers, Dick Toild, and Price as the mainstays should be plenty good.
