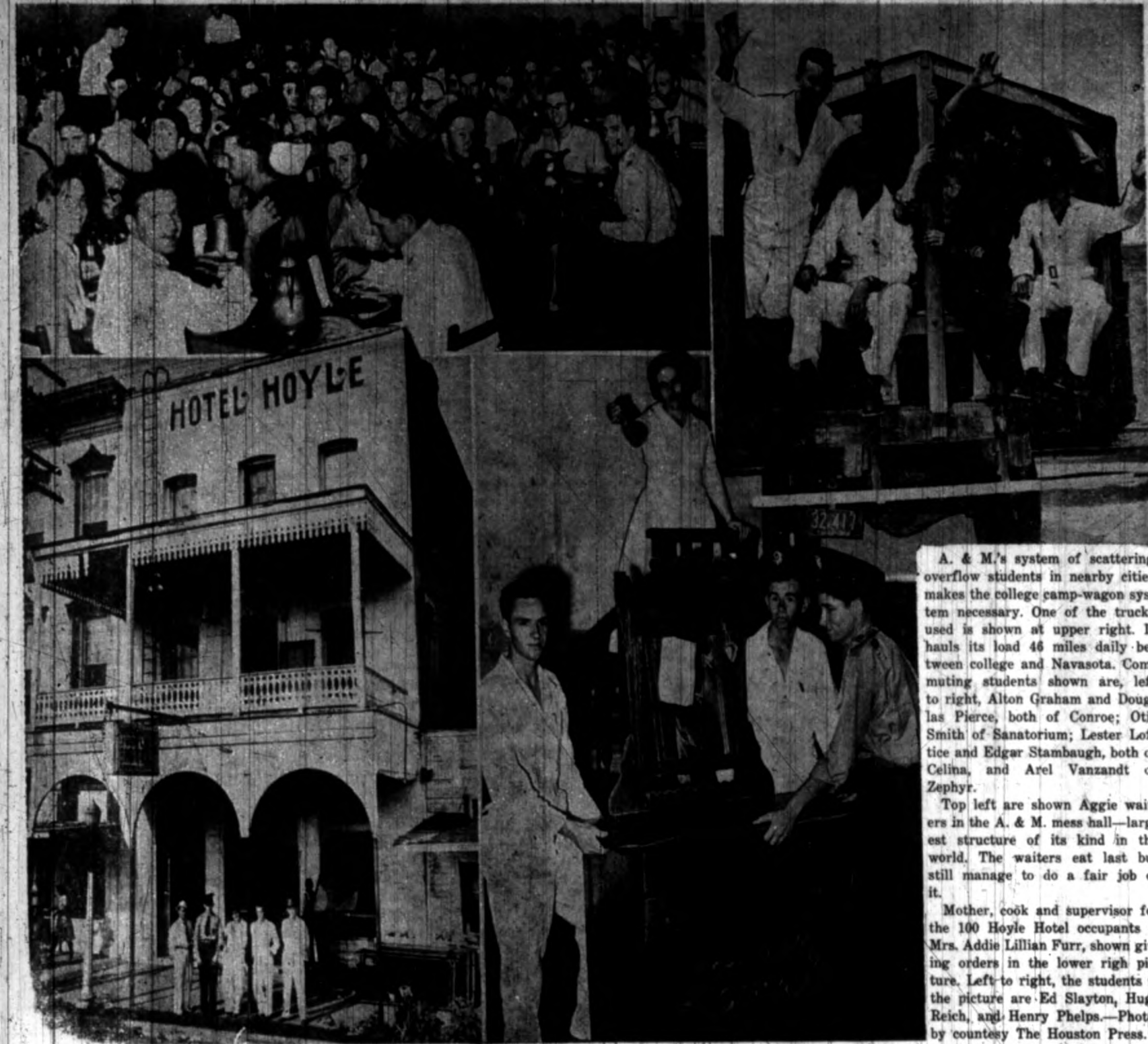


CROWDED A.&M. CAMPUS EXTENDED 23 MILES TO NAVASOTA



Fifty-five thousand forty-eight students have flooded College Station this year, causing some worry to officials on the housing problem. As a result, the college's 3,000-acre campus has been "extended"—46 miles. In the above photographic, a 23-mile extension is portrayed, this section of the campus, using the term loosely, being in Navasota, where some 150 Aggies are living.

One private home and three former hotels are being inhabited now, organized on a cooperative basis by Dr. Dan Russell, head of the Department of Rural Sociology.

According to Dr. Russell, \$2,000 worth of equipment has been in stalled, which will be paid for by those living in the dwellings.

Contrary to popular belief, says Dr. Russell, strict discipline is enforced in the houses by senior and graduate student managers.

Trucks leave Navasota, Bryan, Hearn and Wellborne daily with their cargoes of students. Students must catch their busses at 6:30 a. m.

The Navasota group, under ordinary circumstances, will travel some 9,800 miles this year in search of that thing called "education."

COLLEGE GETS NEW EQUIPMENT FOR MESS HALL

The college has added new equipment to the laundry, mess hall, and sewage disposal plant.

The college laundry has \$6,000 worth of new equipment which included three new drying tumblers, three new shirt presses, one set of sleeve forms and a new washing machine. All of the laundry equipment has been rearranged to facilitate more economical handling by the one hundred employees who are working in the laundry this year.

The sewage disposal plant has been improved, as well as the college creamery, which has secured a new bottling machine which has a capacity of washing, drying and sterilizing sixty bottles of milk a minute.

3 NEW MEN IN POULTRY DEPARTMENT

E. D. Parnell of Cameron, Texas, has been added to the staff of the Poultry Husbandry Department to fill the place recently vacated by the resignation of W. F. Munneryn. Mr. Parnell, a former Vocational Agriculture teacher, has an impressive record as an authority on poultry, and as a coach of poultry judging teams.

Other new members in the Poultry Department include W. H. Wiley and Martin Rosenberg.

Over 200 students have received loans at the beginning of this semester totaling over \$20,000, an average of over \$100.00 per student, according to L. B. Lock of the ex-students association. This is about the same amount as loaned last year.
