3. The units will march to the Southern Pacific depot in the order given below which will be followed in entraining. Tactical Officers will accompany their units.

a. First section. Tactical Officers: Major Irwin, Major Orr, Major Wilson, Captain Garrison, Captain Enslow.

Troops: Band, Corps Staff, Infantry Regiment, Field Artillery Regiment.

Time of departure: 5:15 a. m.
 b. Second Section. Tactical Officers: Major Hill, Major Stickney, Captain Shute.

Troops: Composite Regiment, Cavalry Regiment, Engineer Regiment, Coast Artillery Regiment.

Time of departure: 5:30 a. m.
 4. Troops will march from their respective assembly points at 5:00 a. m.

5. Railroad tickets are on sale at the Southern Pacific depot. Tickets will be purchased prior to 5:00 p. m., Friday, November 4, 1938.

6. Regimental Commanders will report to their respective Tactical Officers enroute to familiarize themselves with the details of the parade before detraining.

7. Senior cadet officers will be stationed in each end of the coaches to see that students do not get

off the train when stops are made enroute, and vestibules will be kept closed.

CIRCULAR NO. 16

1. The Following instructions regarding the parade in Dallas, November 5, are published for the information and guidance of all concerned.

2. DETRAINING:
 The first section will arrive at 9:30 a. m., second second will arrive at 9:45 a. m. Organizations will detrain promptly upon arrival and will march in column of twos, to assembly area:

Infantry Regiment, on Market Street between Commerce and Main. Field Artillery Regiment, on Market Street between Main and Elm. Composite Regiment, on Main between Market and Jefferson.

Cavalry Regiment, on Jefferson between Commerce and Main. Engineer Regiment, on Jefferson between Main and Elm. Coast Artillery Regiment, on Main between Jefferson and Houston.

3. BAGGAGE
 a. Immediately after halting in position at the parade assembly area, each squad will make up a squad roll containing all overcoats and raincoats, securely tied in one bundle and tagged with two tags to each roll. Tags will be distributed by Company Supply Sergeants. Hand baggage will be marked with chalk, the name of the owner, organization, and branch; example, Joe Smith, Troop C Cavalry. Rolls and baggage will be placed in baggage trucks provided. Baggage will be obtained from truck at point of dismissal. Four men will be detailed from each regiment as guards to remain with property and safeguard same during the parade.

b. Point of dismissal will be at Southern Pacific freight depot area.
 c. On detraining members of the Band will secure instruments from the baggage coach and proceed to a moving van provided for the purpose, and leave baggage and instrument cases in the moving van.

4. PARADE
 a. Time: 10:30 a. m.
 b. Assembly: Organizations will assemble in the assembly area designated, in column of platoons, with closed distances.
