## All City Offices To Be Voted On

College Station's regular city election will be held Tuesday, April 4th in the Southern Pacific depot, to elect a mayor, five aldermen, a marshal, a secretary, a city attorney, a city engineer, a sanitary engineer, and a city health officer.

Charles W. Crawford, head of the Mechanical Engineering Department, will preside as judge assisted by such supervisors and clerks as he deems necessary for the efficient and speedy conduction of the election. The polls will be open from 8 a. m. until 6 p. m. and the election will be conducted in accordance with State laws concerning city elections.

Voting will be by ballot and no person will be allowed to vote unless he is qualified as a voter under the constitution and laws of Texas.

- members of the committee for immediate consideration:
- The Library shall buy at once all books already requested.
  - The Library shall buy at once duplicate copies of books that have a very long waiting list.
  - In case the General Reading Fund shall persist:
  - At the beginning of each year, the president of each class shall be asked by the librarian to appoint two men from his class and the editor of The Battalion to name one member of his staff, to constitute a Student Library Committee which shall advise the librarian as to the General Reading Fund and on other relations between the student body and the College Library.
  - The Library shall each year buy, on the following dates—November 15, February 1, and April 1—all requests approved up to that time.
  - On each of those dates, the Library shall spend for popular duplicates (those with long waiting lists) half as much as is then being spent for requests.
  - If requests exceed funds, the committee shall be called together to rank the requests. If a quorum of the committee fail to respond, the librarian will rank the requests.
  - Textbooks shall not be bought from the General Reading Fund.
  - The librarian shall at all times have power to reject requests for any book which he shall consider unfit for inclusion in the College Library.
  - These resolutions, with the financial statement, shall be sent to The Battalion for publication.
