New System of Dorms Will Make Room for Everyone For First Time in Years BY RAY TREADWELL

Next year will see the c corps occupying the newest, most comfortable, dormitory system A. & M. has ever had. Under this plan the majority of the student body will be located in the new dormitory unit composed of 12 buildings to be finished by September, or in the newer buildings of the present dormitory system.

"Cadets will be placed two to a room over the entire campus and upon the completion of the new dormitories it is expected that the older and less desirable halls will not be used for the housing of the students", was the announ made this week by the Comman dant's office.

With the completion of the new buildings it will be possible to accommodate all students who want rooms in the dormitories, a thing that has been impossible in the past due to the lack of adec

The side rooms, made to a commodate two students, will be 11 by 14 feet, with an individual closet for each occupant, one large aluminum-framed window, a lavatory and medicine closet, two desks, a dress er, and a double bunk. The corner rooms will be 12 by 14, with two large windows, On each side of the hall on floor there will be a shower room with six showers. The shower rooms will have con-crete floors and colored plastered walls.
