It was built seven years ago at a cost of \$92,000, and is said to be go d for a hundred years of use. Its 315,000 gallons of water are regularly and frequently tested and kept absolutely free of harmful bacteria. The water, which is actually purer than the water we drink, runs continuously through a filtering and chlorinating system.
