**DORMITORY LAUNDRY SERVICE**  
1. All laundry from the old dormitories will be turned in at the laundry station in two west rooms of Austin Hall.  
2. All laundry from the twelve new dormitories will be turned in to the laundry station at north end of dormitory 12.  
3. Laundry slips will be secured from laundry rooms. The name, address, etc., will be placed in the space designated. It is very essential that the surname be written first on the laundry slip as all students will be assigned new laundry marks. The stub is then torn from the slip and presented to the agent at the time laundry is turned in. When stamped, the stub is your check for your laundry.

The stub is stamped only when presented with laundry bundle. If stub is lost, a duplicate copy may be secured at laundry for 5 cents.
