## FARM POPULATION AGAIN NEARS PEAK

The farm population of the United States on January 1, 1939, was close to the largest on record, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Agricultural Economics, and totaled 32,059,000 people.

The all-time high was 32,077,000 in 1910. From 1910 to 1927 there was a decline of almost 2,000,000 in the farm population. Most of this loss has now been regained.
