 Let's show them we're "tops" both on the football field and on the campus!

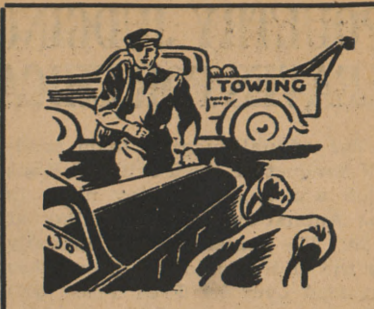
