



Dean E. J. Kyle has withdrawn his resignation as chairman of the Athletic Council. He did this after many ex-students and the members of the Board of Directors asked him to continue. The Dean, when he withdrew his resignation, asked that he be allowed to re-

sign after the 1940 season. Dean Kyle has been connected with athletics at A. & M. since 1903 and the only reason he wants to sever his connections is that he does not have the time to properly fill the position. His work with the School of Agriculture and other administrative duties makes it impossible for him to give as much time to athletics as he thinks he should, as chairman of the Council.

The Dean puts in the time that he should, but much of that time is taken from his private life and time when he should be resting.




