Commanded by Cadet officers chosen from the upper classmen at Randolph Field, these future pilots of Uncle Sam's planes compare favorably, on the parade ground, with their grey-clad brothers of the United States Military Academy at West Point, N. Y.

New classes of Flying Cadets begin their training at Randolph Field every six weeks. While in training these picked young Americans between the ages of 20 and 27 receive \$75 per month, uniforms, board and lodging and other services.


