

Student Leaders Make Plans for 1940-41 Session

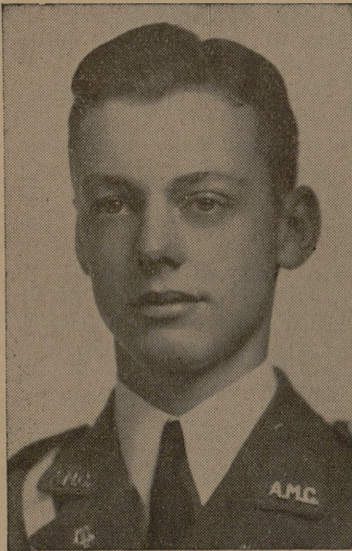
Richey Heads Seniors; Nisbet, Baggett, Power, Montgomery Are Editors

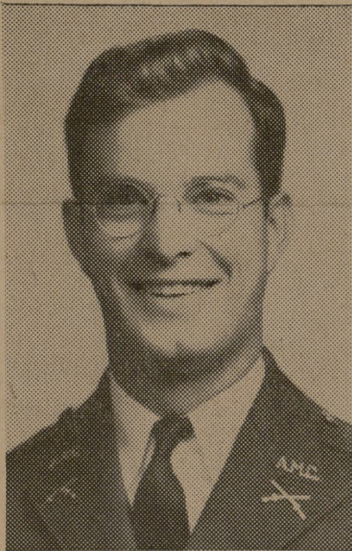
James H. Shelton

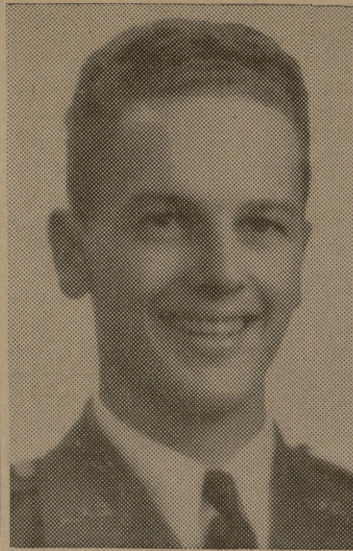
Aubrey V. Hamilton
