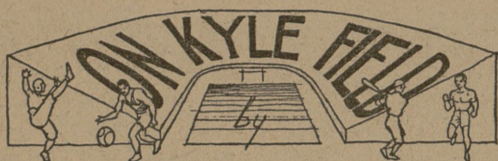


# Last Home Cage Game Tonight With Texas U

## Memories of Last Year's One Point Win On Cage Court Tonite; Aggie Teams To Waco

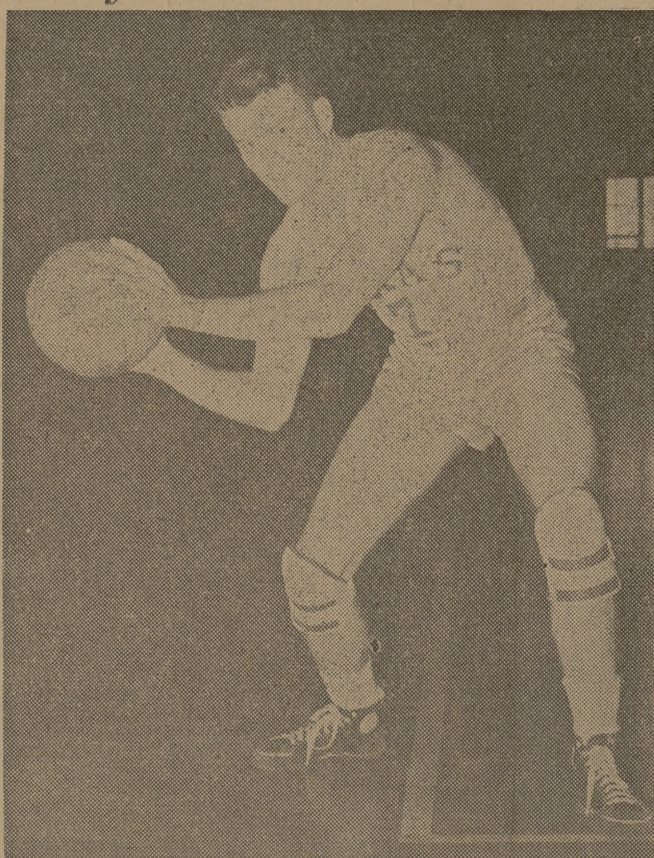
