One of the good old tunes of yesteryear is currently going the rounds on the nickelodeons. It's vocally by the King Sisters again and backed ably by Bob Crosby's

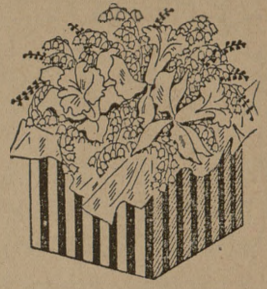
## Goodwill Spreaders- Concert Aggie Band

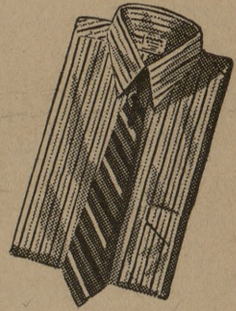

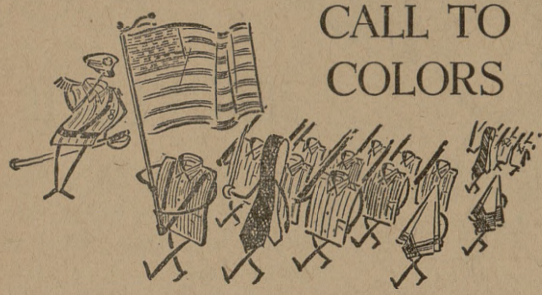

### Improved A&M Concert Band Is Tops For Spirit and Color

Actively engaged in spreading goodwill will for A. & M. in various parts of the state in recent weeks, the concert group of the Aggie Band is beginning a season of musical entertainment with its most promising set-up in recent years. Director Lieut. Col. R. J. Dunn claims it to be the best aggregation of musicians to come under his direction in the Aggie Band since 1929.

Composed of the "cream" of the regular 216 piece Aggie Band, the concert group each year plays concerts for Parents' Day, various Sunday afternoons throughout the spring, and a final concert during the last week of school. This year, however, the band has made trips to Victoria and to Galveston for performances in those cities. At Victoria the band acted as guest artist for the annual music festival held in that city. Attending the festival were some 50 high school bands from that section of the state, who came for the purpose of playing before judges for criticism for the state and national contests. At Galveston the band played a concert, the proceeds of which were used by the Galveston Rotary club in their drive for a playground park for boys.

Seniority of rank or years holds no ties on this year's concert band. Ratings as to seating order in a

section are made strictly upon musical ability and effort produced. Novel is the sight to see a "fish" holding down a first chair position, but such is the case in at least two sections.

The concert band has made favorable impressions upon its audiences this spring with the finesse and polish of its musical technique, but the factor that makes the unit a success is the spirit and feeling introduced into its music. "They send thrill-wave up and down my spinal cord and produce goosebumps all over me when they swing into a stirring march," a member of the Victoria audience was heard to comment.

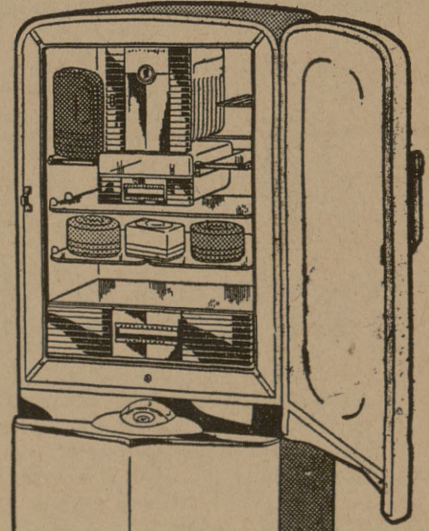
