



Baker Leads Second Seminar On South America

C. L. Baker, head of the department of Geology, lead a disday forenoon session. cussion on the Wealth and Pov-

erty of South America last night in the Chemistry Lecture Room. This was the second discussion meeting held by the Seminar on South American Relationships.

Dr. Baker has spent a great deal of time in South American countries making geological explorations and talked on the natural resources in this continent. He also discussed the large industries that are now being built up in South America and stressed the importance of their having large industrial centers in the event of invasion of this country or South America by some outside power. There will be two more meet ings of the Seminar on South American Relationships to be held on April 28 and May 12. This will complete the series of seminars. The next meeting will be under the direction of G. W. Schesselman, professor of agricultural economics and will deal with the trade and economic situation in the Latin American countries. The last meeting will be under the guidance of Professor J. J. Woolket of the modern language department and will explain the cultural situation in South America.

At the banquet session of the group, Mrs. Daniels Scoates of College Station, whose late husband formerly headed the A. & M. agricultural engineering department, was honored by being seated at the speakers' table. 
