### **Extension Service Employs Garth To** Supervise Mohair

Walter Garth, Jr., of Sanford, Maine, has been employed by the Texas Extension Service, effective August 1, to supervise mohair grading in Texas during the fall season, Director H. H. Williamson announces. Garth was associated with the Texas Mohair grading committee during the fall and spring seasons of 1940-41 in developing proper grades and methods of grading. The committee is composed of mohair producers and warehousemen.

W. R. Nisbet, Extension Service animal husbandman, with whom Garth will work, said that it was the purpose to develop in the early fall season a definition of the standards by which mohair is to be graded. Garth will help define the grades and after these have been accepted by growers, warehousemen, dealers and mills, efforts will be made to have them established as standard grades for the United States.
