Aggies Should Go on Another Scoring Spree in New York; Strength of Ags Still Unknown

New York and Yankee Stadium will be the next stop of the highest scoring team in the nation—the Texas Aggies. They have compiled a total of 95 points in two games, and should have another scoring session against N. Y. U. Marty Karow scouted the Violets in their game with Lafayette last week, and from Marty's reports, the Aggies should have little trouble with the New Yorkers. The climate and the atmosphere and all such bunk may be different up in the "Big City" but that's what the experts said about Texas and Colorado, and the Longhorns scored as much as they wished.

It is still too early to tell anything about the team. True, nobody expected the Aggies to run up such high scores, especially against A. & I., but then, the competition the Ags have been getting is nothing to brag about. In their two games, the cadets have indicated that they have some of the flashiest backs in the conference. They have also just about solved their problem for a passer in Derace Moser, Lee Daniels and Tom Pickett. But the thing that worried the coaches at the start of the season is still very much in evidence. That is the middle of the cadet line—it's still obviously the weak link of the team, and unless it is patched up in a hurry, we're going to hear more than a tuncful of taps. The centers have improved, yes, but not enough to assure the coaches confidence in that respect. As for the guards, Homer Norton still has trouble in finding the right combination. The first week he used Les Richardson and Ray Mulhollan, and the next he started Roy Bueck and Weldon Maples. Bueck played for above par against A. & I., and it is almost sure that he will start next Saturday. However, the other guard is a problem. Richardson will probably start the game unless he is still bothered with his calf injury. In that case, Maples will take his place.

Sports Squibs From Here and There; New York Game to be Broadcast This Saturday

The A. & M. - N. Y. U. game will be broadcast Saturday afternoon at 1 o'clock by Dan Riss over N. B. C. in behalf of the Humbel Oil and Refining Company. Notes on S. W. Conference statistics compiled by H. B. "Red" McElroy and Roy P. Gates of the A. & M. Publicity Department. Cullen Rogers, Aggie halfback is the leading scorer in the conference with 24 markers. Jack Wilson of Baylor is the leading punter with a 40.7 average in two games. Derace Moser is the leading passer with 18 aeriels completed out of 32 for 241 yards. Marshall Spivey is the leading receiver, catching eight passes for a 107 yard gain. Who was the guy that said Spivey would be out of the lineup? Boy, is his face red. Kyle Gillespie of T. C. U. is the leading pass interceptor, catching four enemy passes for a 56 yard return average. The Aggies have attempted 68 passes and have completed 36 for an average of 52.9. Not bad for a team that wasn't supposed to have a passer.

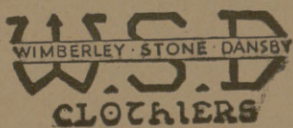

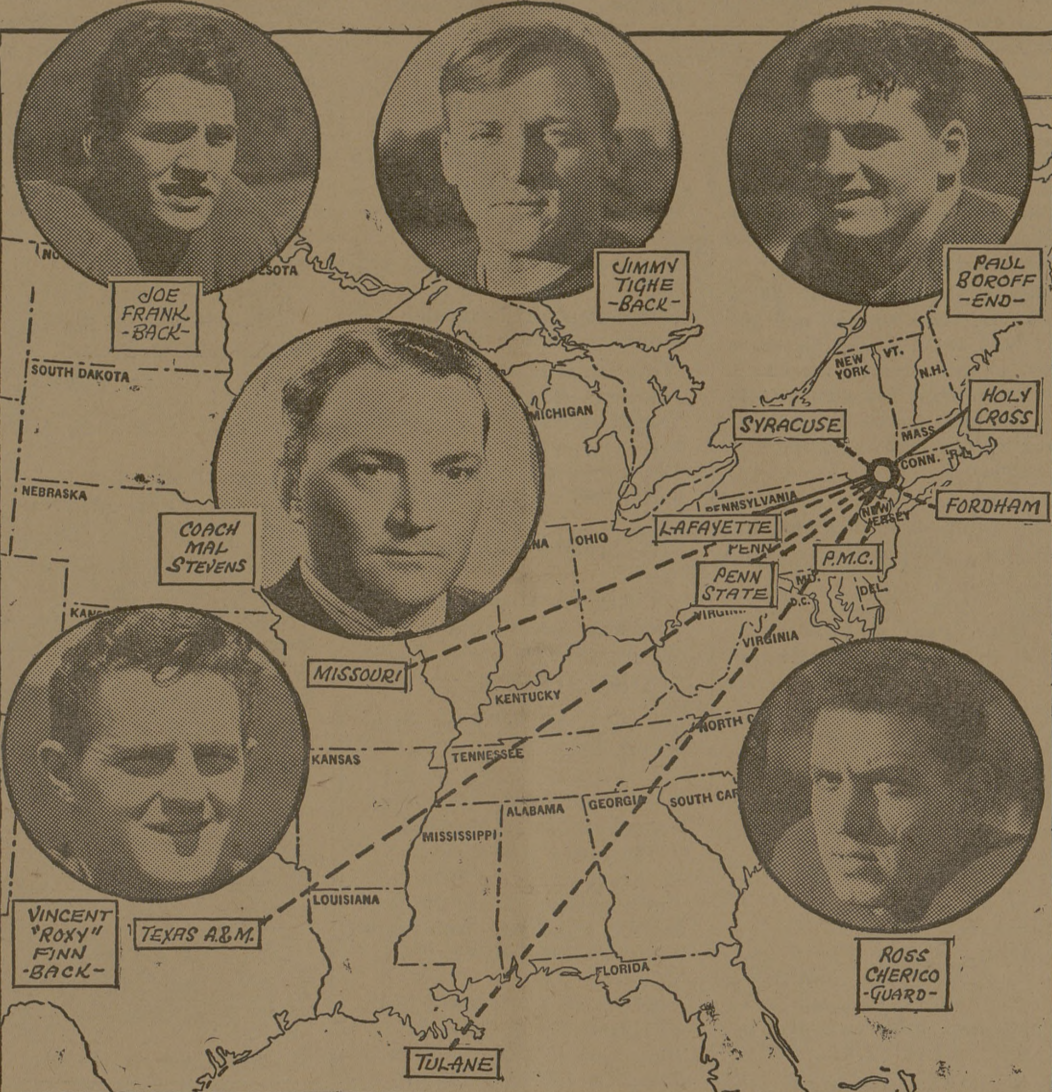
