
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



Seniors interested in athletics who are to graduate and enter the army this year will not have to cast away their interest in sports. The Physical Education department has introduced this semester a one hour course to train men for duty in the army as athletic and recreational officers.

W. L. Penberthy of the Physical Education department and instructor in the course announces that 35 seniors are taking the course. The class meets in the Civil Engineering lecture room each Wednesday from 5 to 6 p. m.

The course includes a study of the drawing up of tournaments; and instruction in the types of contests, round robins, and meets. Purchasing and caring for equipment is also covered in the course. Instruction in the layout of fields and courts, and contest rules and regulations is another phase of the emester's work.

The course is to be continued in the second semester and is open to any senior, whether taking advanced R.O.T.C. or not.
