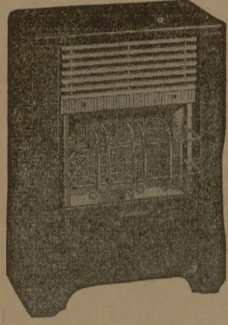

Hart played one of the best games of his career in spite of an injury that threatened to keep him out of play. Showing very aggressive playing on the offensive he sparked the Aggie victory for the first two chukkers at the No. 2 spot and the last four chukkers at the number four spot. McGowan played a fine game at one on both the offense and defense to push through the passes of his teammates. Three lettermen not ordinarily in the starting lineup played fine ball to keep the team on top for the opening game. Lee Rice went the whole game at the No. 3 spot, T. A. Williams went three chukkers at the No. 4 and No. 1 spots, and Jack Buie did an excellent job at the No. 2 spot for four chukkers. Each of these men pushed through one goal a piece.

Wynn Humberton of Houston played a beautiful game for Shreveport at the No. 3 spot to score three of their five goals. A once famous player from Houston Humberton has played little polo in the last two years but was easily the outstanding hitter on the field. Hershil Schivilly at the No. 1 spot for Shreveport scored one goal and Butler from Austin scored one at the No. 2 spot. Sam Brown of Shreveport finished out the Shreveport lineup. Dr. E. V. Young, sparkplug of the team, was unable to come at the last minute.

to attendance at the camp of their own unit. Students will submit their request for this training for the approval of the professor of military science and tactics and the corps area commander.

Prospective graduates of other senior ROTC units who desire to transfer will follow the following procedure in making their applications:

1. Applications will be made at the office of the commandant and special qualifications of the student will be indicated.
2. If the applicant is not recommended by the professor of military science and tactics or the head of the college, the application will not be forwarded, but the applicant will be given an opportunity to apply for appointment in the section in which ROTC training is being given.
3. Applications will be processed and forwarded to the office of the Adjutant General in Washington.
4. Upon receipt of the application in the office of the Adjutant General, the application will be sent for recommendation to the chief of the arm of service in which appointment is sought. If the action is unfavorable the applicant, if otherwise qualified, will be tendered appointment in the section in which he is being given ROTC training.

Engineering 185 freshmen, 84 sophomores, 68 juniors, and 56 seniors; Engineering Administration three juniors and 12 seniors. Industrial Education 31 freshmen, 23 sophomores, 20 juniors, 17 seniors, and two graduate students; Mechanical Engineering 385 freshmen, 232 sophomores, 178 juniors, 120 seniors, one fifth year man and three graduate students; Petroleum Engineering 167 freshmen, 75 sophomores, 74 juniors, 60 seniors, and four fifth year men; Pre-Med 31 freshmen, 19 sophomores, 15 juniors, 27 seniors, and seven fifth year men; Veterinary Medicine two special students, 80 freshmen, 90 sophomores, 95 juniors, 82 seniors 56 fifth year men, and one graduate student.

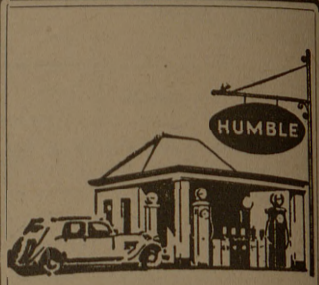
Enrollment by classes is as follows: six special students, 2,533 freshmen, 1,572 sophomores, 1,299 juniors, 1,058 seniors, 74 fifth year men and 137 graduate students to make up the total of 6,679.

During the 1940 year there were 10 special students, 2,246 freshmen, 1,601 sophomores, 1,410 juniors, 996 seniors, 93 fifth year men, and 178 graduate students.

Ray Putnam who has joined the staff of the department of agricultural economics has made an outstanding record in athletics at Iowa State. That college rates him as the most outstanding track athlete ever to graduate from that institution. For two years he was track captain and has won six athletic letters in intercollegiate competition. He was a member of the All America track team and a first place winner at the National Collegiate meet, the Texas relays, the Drake Relays, Kansas Relays and Illinois Relays.

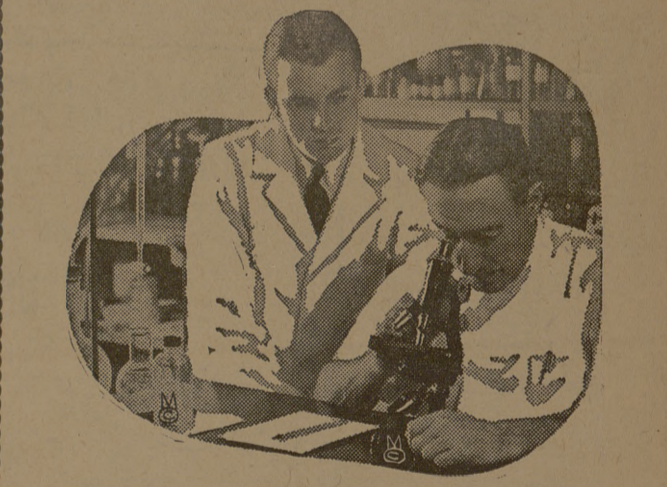
