# Basketball Team Opens Season Dec 8

Six States to Be **Covered During The** Christmas Holidays

The Texas Aggie basketball team will be the "travelingest' squad in the conference. Playing Sam Houston State Teachers here Monday, December 8, as an opener, they take to the road eight days later and play the Phillips 66 Oilers in Houston. After that the team will cover six states in maintaining their playing schedule.

The team will be gone from the state of Texas all during the Christmas holidays and will play such northern teams as Purdue University, Kentucky University, Bradley Polytechnic Institute, Washington University and Oregon State College

This will be the first time an Aggie basketball team has made such a long trip and Coach Marty Karow has indicated that he will carry about fifteen men with him. Such a trip will give the Aggie cagers a chance to see how the game is played by top northern teams. At Purdue, winning the Big Ten championship is almost a tradition and the Aggies will have a chance to see how they stack up against the nation's finest basketball team
