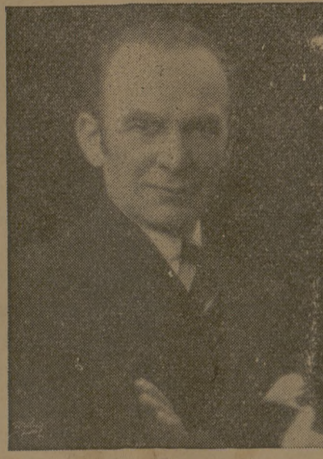

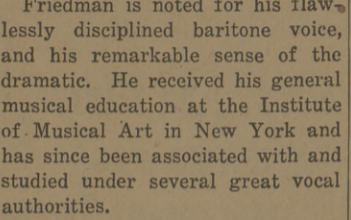

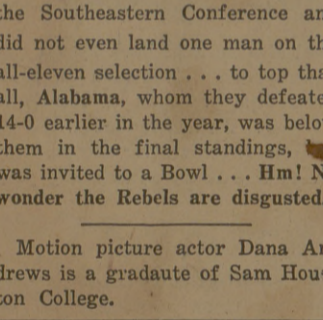

Human Alarm Clocks Aren't Lucky at All

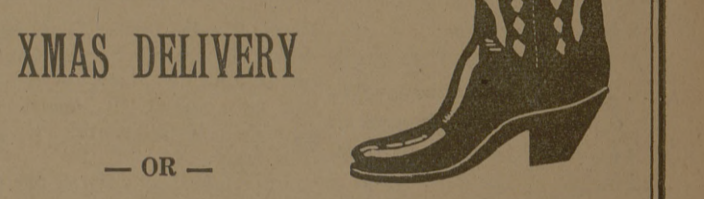
"Human alarm clocks" may have something with which they can impress their friends, but they don't do themselves any good by being able to hop out of bed at any given time.
