


The Mustangs have yet to win their first conference basketball game while the Aggies have won but two games in the cage race.





Nudine Princess De Kol, a Holstein cow owned by A. & M., is the 535th Holstein to produce more than 100,000 pounds of milk.

In eight lactations this cow produced a total of 104,919 pounds of milk containing 3,334 pounds of butterfat. Her highest single lactation record was 16,748 pounds of milk made on three milkings daily beginning at the age of 8 years. Nudine produced enough milk to fill 4,850 10-quart pails to overflowing. 
