

It is true that all poisonous snakes in the United States, save the Coral snake, have elliptical pupils, and a characteristic pit between the nostrils and eyes. Poisonous snakes have, as a rule, broad, flat heads, but there are also examples of non-poisonous snakes with similarly shaped skulls. The ability of recognize

poisonous varieties takes a certain amount of experience and study-the best way of making sure never to pick up a poisonous variety is to leave all snakes alone.






